Myron Rubbert, age 79, of Upham, North Dakota, passed away on October 23, 2008, in a Minot hospital. Funeral services were held October 28, 2008, at St. John's Lutheran church, rural Upham. Myron Rubbert, a son of Edgar and Ruphena (Knuth) Rubbert, was born on December 25, 1928 on the family farm near Deep, North Dakota. He was baptized into the Christian faith on January 20, 1929, at St. John's Lutheran Church of rural Upham. He attended grade school in Deep, later going by horseback to Russell for high school. Myron attended the Wahpeton School of Science for a time. At the age of fifteen, Myron learned to fly and began aerial spraying in 1948. Myron was helpful to the community in the winter of 1948-1949, when he delivered mail by air to Upham and Newburg. He also transported friends who needed medical attention. On April 2, 1950, Myron married Jean Phinney at St. John's Lutheran Church.

In 1954, they bought some land and began farming with his father. They built a second house on the home farm in 1955. In 1968, he took over the family farm when his father passed away. They had resided there since.

His spraying career lasted over 50 years. Myron was a life long member of the St. John's Lutheran Church. He also held several church offices as well as being a Bible class leader and Sunday school teacher. Myron served on several boards. He also enjoyed hunting, fishing and reading.
